Charles R. Angione, 85, of Bangor passed away Sunday, January 7, 2024, at St. Luke's Hospital-Anderson Campus, Bethlehem.

Charles was born in Bronz, New York on January 22, 1938, a son of the late Anthony and Dorothy (Maranzi) Angione. He and his beloved wife, former Joan DeMond were married 63 years on April 16, 2023.

Charles honorable served in the US Army Signal Corp from 1956 to 1958. He dedicated his life to the Plainfield Fire Company in Plainfield NJ for 25 years retiring as Deputy Fire Chief. During that time, he served as an Arson Investigator and trainer for incoming firemen. He wrote a book titled "Days and Night of Fire and also wrote a column in the Pennsylvania Firemen Magazine. He also wrote poetry and was an avid reader of books and poetry. Coming to Pennsylvania he became an avid bird watcher and enjoyed learning the different species. He was a New York Yankee and Giants fan and was an avid fitness enthusiast and never missed a day of working out.
